#### IMPORTANT CALL TO ACTION

Oppose the Concealed Carry Reciprocity Bill  
Help the MA Coalition Reach 8 Key U.S. Senators

There is a dangerous bill now in Congress called "Concealed Carry Reciprocity." Currently each state

sets its own requirements for carrying concealed loaded guns in public. Some states, including MA, require firearms training and local police authorization before obtaining a concealed carry permit. Alarming, 12 states do not require any permit or training for the legal carrying of a handgun, either loaded or unloaded, openly or concealed.

If this law passes, an armed person from a state with no gun license requirements and no concealed carry permit requirements would be within the law to carry a loaded gun into any other state, overriding that state's laws. This means that despite Massachusetts' strong laws, we would have people entering our state who could be carrying concealed weapons without any safety training, and without having been subject to our strict licensing requirements.

Law enforcement overwhelmingly opposes this legislation. It will be difficult for police to know whether a person carrying a handgun has been properly vetted in their home state.

This bill is the NRA's number-one priority. The gun lobby has been trying to pass reciprocity legislation for over two decades. They are trying again.

There are 8 senators who are particularly important in efforts to defeat this bill. These are Democrats who voted for a similar bill in 2013. [Click here to read the full article and to find phone numbers and calling instruction -be sure to scroll down the page.](#)

UU Meeting of South Berkshire recently hosted the screening of a documentary in process by Oscar nominated director Fidel Moreno, "Gathering Our Hearts at Standing Rock". Culled from interviews with First Nation people and supporters at Standing Rock, the film provided powerful insight into what guides the resolve of those who have been standing at Standing Rock to protect sacred land and water, and draw attention to the environmental impact of the Dakota Access Pipeline.

We invited other area social justice, faith based, and environmental groups to join us as community partners to spread the word about the screening and provide a panel of area experts who could update us on the CT pipeline and Housatonic River cleanup. Eighteen community partners, including UU Mass Action, took us up on our offer. Approximately 150 people attended.

Over \$600 was collected toward a new Standing Rock site and completion of the documentary film. It was an informative and moving event and we encourage other UUs to consider something similar.

### **Eversource Rate increase:**

On January 17, 2017, Eversource Energy submitted a proposal to the Department of Public Utilities (DPU) to update the company's electric rates. The proposal requests a net increase in annual delivery revenue of \$60.2 million, representing a 7 percent increase in those revenues to support our electric distribution operations.

Eversource's request addresses increases in operating and maintenance costs and capital costs associated with investments in the electric network since the last decision by the DPU approving a general distribution rate increase in 2006.

The DPU will conduct public hearings in Eversource's service area, and then make a decision by November 30, 2017 for new rates to become effective January 1, 2018.

**WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH SANCTUARY & SOLIDARITY?**

**Why we Must Answer the call to Action**

The pain felt by so many became especially difficult with the recent story of Mamadou. What we know is that after losing both his parents, Mamadou fled his home country of Papua New Guinea for Mexico. Once he crossed the border he asked for asylum but instead, was placed into detention where he has remained for the past year.

Last Friday, ICE (Immigration & Customs Enforcement) informed his lawyers that if they could find him a home by 5 pm he would be released. Within two hours, our interfaith partner, MCAN (Mass Community Action Network) found a home for Mamadou, but when his lawyers called ICE at 4:00 PM to let them know, they were told it was too late for the weekend.

Since then, ICE has done a test on Mamadou's teeth and determined that he is over 18 (~20). We are unclear how reliable that test is (given the health disparities in his country of origin) but it has given ICE reason to not release him.

People of faith must work together, organize and be prepared at all times to take action.

### **Reaching out to our Neighbors in Fitchburg**

In downtown Fitchburg, there is the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community at 370 Main Street; and at 923 Main Street is our Unitarian Universalist Church. Our proximity to each other makes it natural that we reach out to them. Every Saturday evening at 6 p.m., the Mosque hosts "Coffee, Cake, and True Islam." Several members of our church have attended the Saturday evening get together and some are regulars. It is a time to hear about Islam and ask questions.

In the late Fall one of our members, Alex Hutchins, invited some of the Muslim Community to visit us for a service, which they did. We are a 50% lay-led community, and, to that end, they were invited to do a service for us which took place on March 12, 2017, titled "*Tolerance in an Intolerant World.*" About 5 adult men, one woman, and two children from the Muslim Community were in attendance with us. We hope to continue this relationship with our friends at the Ahmadiyya Community.
